RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF BEACHWOOD, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO NEW JERSEY’S CLEAN ENERGY PROGRAM FOR A MUNICIPAL /LOCAL GOVERNMENT AUDIT PROGRAM GRANT.

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities has authorized an incentive program to subsidize a portion of the cost to municipalities or other local government entities for completing an energy audit of their eligible facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Beachwood desires to complete an energy audit of the Borough’s eligible facilities; and

WHEREAS, the governing body desires to authorize the preparation and submission of an application to New Jersey’s Clean Energy Program for a Municipal/Local Government Audit Program grant for the completion of an energy audit of the Borough’s eligible facilities.

WHEREAS, there has been a bipartisan call from Senators Bateman and Lesniak to the Governor to delay implementation of the Affordable Housing rules and to extend the December 31, 2008 deadline for submission of an Affordable Housing Plan and spending plan due to the unwieldy and onerous nature of these rules and requirements, which are currently being legally challenged by both municipalities and developers; and

WHEREAS, there are estimates that implementation of these Affordable Housing Rules will cost cities, towns and school districts at least two billion dollars annually over the next two years and that, as stated by Senator Bateman, “these regulations are an incredible twenty billion dollar unfunded mandate forced upon communities struggling to cope with the worst financial crisis since the Great Depression”; and

WHEREAS a delay in implementation will give the Borough of Beachwood an opportunity to consider effective and reasonable creation of Affordable Housing opportunities in a logical manner which includes the participation of the members of the community and affected property owners; and
