Hernandez 26, of Waldwick, N.J.; assigned to the 1st Battalion, 327th Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division, Fort Campbell, Ky.; died Dec. 4 in Bayji, Iraq, from wounds sustained when his vehicle encountered an improvised explosive device.



Our war dead must always be remembered. Their Heroism deserves its glory, so too does the bravery of each who entered the unknown of conflict and gave their lives to the cause of Freedom.

WHEREAS, the Governor's Government Efficiency and Reform (GEAR) Commission released a report of it's Task Force on sentencing and corrections; and

Esteemed Mayor and Board Members of the Council,

On behalf of the Beachwood Volunteer First Aid Squad, I would like to thank the current board for all of their hard work, dedication, and steadfast commitment to enhancing the quality of life for residents of Beachwood. Consistent with your values, the members of the Beachwood First Aid Squad have worked hard over the past 50 years to provide timely, efficient and professional pre-hospital care and transport of the sick and injured within our community. In an effort to maintain current membership, recruit new members, and provide incentive for the volunteer emergency medical services in our community, the Beachwood First Aid Squad requests that you endorse our proposal for a ballot referendum (in November 2008) to implement a Length of Service Award Program (LOSAP) for our members, similar to the existing program for the Beachwood Volunteer Fire Department.

The Beachwood Volunteer First Aid Squad averages between 800 and 900 requests for emergency assistance each year. We provide unconditional support to the Beachwood Fire Company by providing standby coverage at most of their drills and at all of their involved callouts.

In addition to providing emergency services to the residents of Beachwood, the squad provides community education in the forms of First Aid, CPR and 911 classes for the entire community. We further support the community by providing standby coverage at all community sponsored events, such as the annual Pine Beach 5k run, the Beachwood Memorial Day celebration and the 4th of July Fireworks celebration on Toms River.

In order to continue to provide these services to the borough of Beachwood, the retention of current membership and the recruitment of new members are of paramount importance. 
I am writing to you on behalf of the Beachwood Soccer Club to ask for your help. There seems to be some concern with Dogs being brought inside the Soccer Complex and we are asking for your assistance to rectify this problem.

I am aware that currently there is no town ordinance that specifically deals with this particular area and I was hoping this could be addressed at the upcoming Town Council meeting and maybe such an ordinance could be created.

Currently there is a sign that says "No Dogs permitted", however this does not seem to be a deterrent. The public continues to bring their dogs up to the complex to walk and or roam. This creates a two-fold problem for the members of the Soccer Club who utilize this complex on a regular basis, from the months of March through November. First, is the obvious concern when dog owners do not pick up after their dogs. We have had a couple of instances whereby a soccer player winds up on the ground only to get up and find that he had the remnants of dog excrement on him from a mess that was not cleaned up. Secondly, when spectators bring their dogs to soccer events, it poses a safety problem. Dogs get excited on occasion when a lot of people are running and yelling, which is the epitome of a soccer match. Although it has yet to happen, I fear that a dog could very well break free from an owner or leash and put the players in danger during a soccer match. It is not uncommon, from the fields that I have visited, over my course of playing and coaching Soccer, to see the fields we travel to have a strict "no dog" policy and I can't help but to think it is for the very reasons mentioned above.

Anything you could do to facilitate a new "ordinance" that would allow us to apply for new signs to be placed along the complex perimeter would be appreciated. Toms River Schools is willing to help out and have the signs made, but we are to give them the actual ordinance, which I understand must be found on the sign itself if it is to be enforceable. Thank you in advance for any help you can give with this issue.


